

NEW FUNDING FOR ADVANCE CARE PLANS

Funding is now available for initial advance care plans for our eligible population that meet the quality requirement: \$90 if the plans are loaded on Whānau Tahī Shared Care (WTSC) platform at the practice and \$70.00 for an electronically documented plan sent to Counties Manukau Health using the eReferral pathway.

The health provider developing the plan must have completed at least level 1 ACP training - preferably level 1a.

The eligible population is community dwelling patients without dementia who are enrolled in a Counties Manukau practice and are over 18 years with a long-term condition, Māori and Pacific Island people over the age of 65 years, or people of other ethnicities aged 75 years and older.

To fulfil the quality requirements the plan must capture sufficient consistent content to be clinically relevant in an emergency situation.
